


1 Form A Solid-State Relay

DESCRIPTION

The VOR1142 is a 400 V single channel normally open optically isolated solid-state relay (SPST - 1 form A). Based on hybrid architecture which allows fast switching times with a wide operating ambient temperature range. A high efficient GaAlAs IRED enables low forward current on the input side. On the output side high performance MOSFET switches provide a low R_{ON} and can switch both DC and AC signals.







Fig. 1 - Timing Schematic




Fig. 3 - Safety Input Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 4 - Maximum Load Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 5 - Forward Voltage vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 6 - Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig. 7 - Normalized Forward Current for Switch Turn-On vs.

Ambient Temperature




Fig. 8 - Normalized On-Resistance vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 9 - Output Capacitance vs. Load Voltage




Fig. 10 - Off-State Leakage Current vs. Load Voltage




Fig. 11 - Turn-On Time vs. Forward Current




Fig. 12 - Normalized Turn-On Time vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 13 - Turn-Off Time vs. Forward Current






Fig. 14 - Normalized Turn-Off Time vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 15 - VOR1142B4




Fig. 16 - Tape and Reel Packing




Fig. 17 - Lead (Pb)-free Reflow Solder Profile According to J-STD-020 for SMD Devices
